


Knots to know

The Palomar knot

The Palomar is a general-purpose knot for joining fishing line to swivels, snaps, hooks and lures. The double wrap of line through the eyelet provides added strength. The Palomar Knot is easy to tie correctly.




The improved clinch knot


The secret of this knot is wrapping the line at least five times around iself before running in through the formed loop. Use it for up to 20 lb line.




1. Pull a good amount of line through the eye of the hook.



3. Wrap line over itself, at least five times.



4. Feed line through loop above hook eye.




6. Tighten while ensuring that coils stack neatly. Trim tag end.





The double clinch knot

The unique double-wrap design of the double clinch provides a strong, reliable connection that resists slippage and premature failure. It can be used to join line to swivels, snaps, hook and lures.



1. Run the end of the line through the eye of the hook or lure, then double back through the eye a second time.

2. Loop around the standing part of the line, 5 or 6 times.

3. Thread the tag end back between the loops above the hook eye as shown.

4. Tighten coils neatly and clip tag end.
